# Legislative Update

### 117th Congress



### 11 Bills Introduced

Bipartisan Border Solutions Act of 2021

Reduces the impact of migration surges on local communities and ensures migrants are treated fairly.



## 245+ Bills Cosponsored

Invest to Protect Act of 2022

Makes critical, targeted investments in police departments with fewer than 125 sworn officers for the recruitment, retention, and training they need to protect our communities.



## 200+ Bills Passed into Law


Jaime Zapata and Victor Avila Federal Law Enforcement Protection Act

Closed extradition loopholes, allowing those who cause harm to federal agents in foreign countries to be tried in the US.



## **Inflation Reduction Act**

"The Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) makes urgent investments to lower prescription drug costs, health care costs, and energy costs to create opportunities for America's 33 million small businesses and startups." \*



**38,000** people in TX-28 were ensured access to affordable health care because of the IRA. Otherwise, these individuals would have lost their coverage.\*\*



Annual premiums for the Affordable Care Act insurance plans have been brought down by an average of **\$564** in Texas.\*\*



The Inflation Reduction Act puts an annual \$2,000 cap on seniors' out of pocket spending on prescription drugs.



The IRA prevents Medicare beneficiaries from paying more than **\$35 per month** for insulin.



# Infrastructure Funding

Congress passed the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law in November 2021. Since then, we have already seen millions in investments come to South Texas including:


