Law Enforcement

COPS Hiring Program

Project description: The Fiscal Year 2024 COPS Hiring Program is a competitive award program designed to provide funding directly to law enforcement agencies to hire and/or rehire additional career law enforcement officers in an effort to increase their community policing capacity and crime prevention efforts.

Eligibility:

- Local law enforcement agencies
- State law enforcement agencies
- Territorial law enforcement agencies

Application due date: June 12, 2024

FY24 Connect and Protect: Law Enforcement Behavioral Health Response Program

Project description: This program supports law enforcement—behavioral health cross-system collaboration to improve public health and public safety by improving responses to and outcomes for individuals with mental health disorders or co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders. Through this opportunity, the Bureau of Justice Assistance provides grant funding to help entities prepare, create, or expand comprehensive plans and then implement these collaborative projects to target people who qualify.

Eligibility:

- Public- and state-controlled institutions of higher education

Application due date: May 6, 2024

FY24 Veterans Treatment Court (VTC) Discretionary Grant Program

Project description: With this solicitation, Bureau of Justice Assistance seeks to provide financial and technical assistance to states, state courts, local courts, units of local government, and federally recognized Indian tribal governments to plan, implement, and enhance the operations of VTCs including service coordination, participant service and supervision coordination, fidelity to the VTC model, and recovery support services.

FY24 Matthew Shepard and James Byrd, Jr. Hate Crimes Program

Project description: With this solicitation, Bureau of Justice Assistance seeks to support efforts by state, local, and tribal law enforcement and prosecution agencies and their partners in conducting outreach, educating practitioners and the public, enhancing victim reporting tools, and investigating and prosecuting hate crimes committed on the basis of a victim's perceived or actual race, color, religion, national origin, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, or disability.

Eligibility:

FY24 Enhancing School Capacity To Address Youth Violence

Project description: With this solicitation, the Office of Juvenile Justice Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) seeks to support targeted efforts to address youth violence in a school-based setting (K–12th grade only). OJJDP seeks to increase school safety through the development and expansion of evidence-based and promising violence prevention and reduction programs and strategies to support school climate. Through this initiative, OJJDP expects applicants to utilize a collaborative approach between schools and community-based organizations to develop and implement these strategies.

Transportation

FY23-24 Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvements Grant Program

Project description: This program funds projects that improve the safety, efficiency, and reliability of intercity passenger and freight rail.

Criminal Justice

<u>Fiscal Year 2024 Training and Services to End Violence and Abuse of Women Later in Life Program</u>

Project description: The Training and Services to End Abuse in Later Life Program supports a comprehensive approach to addressing abuse in later life, including domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, neglect, abandonment, economic abuse, or willful harm committed against victims who are 50 years of age or older.

Eligibility:

Agriculture and Environment

Clean Heavy-Duty Vehicles Grants

Project description: This funding to support Zero-Emission vehicles will benefit communities across the United States, especially communities that are disproportionately burdened by air pollution and marginalized by underinvestment. These replacement vehicles will ensure cleaner air for the communities in which they operate. The reduction in greenhouse gas emissions from these vehicle replacements will also help address the outsized role of the transportation sector in fueling the climate crisis.

FY 2024 Citizenship and Integration Grant Program: Citizenship Instruction and Naturalization Application Services

Project description: The goal of the Citizenship and Integration Grant Program is to expand the availability of high-quality citizenship preparation services for lawful permanent residents across the nation and to provide opportunities for immigrants to gain the knowledge and skills necessary to integrate into the fabric of American society.
