



# Water Resources Development Act of 2024

Prioritizes the improvement of water infrastructure across South Texas, including Webb, Zapata, Bexar, and Guadalupe Counties.

### **End of Year Funding Bill**

Secured \$20 Million in Federal Funding for Water Infrastructure in Laredo Secured \$10 billion in economic assistance for farmers and ranchers.

Secured \$21 billion in disaster assistance for farmers and ranchers.

Secured language to provide economic support to farmers who have been negatively impacted by Mexico's failure to deliver water to the United States in accordance with the 1944 Water Treaty.


