Provides Resources to Help Reform Local Departments (No Defunding of Police)

Active / Passed Legislation

Rep. Cuellar, as a Senior Member of the U.S. House Appropriations Committee, supports funding numerous initiatives to improve police practices.

Rep. Cuellar is <u>Lead Sponsor</u> of the Jaime Zapata and Victor Avila Federal Law Enforcement Protection Act {Senate Companion Bill Passed Senate}

- Ensures that individuals who have killed or attempted to kill U.S. federal officers and employees serving abroad can be brought to justice and prosecuted in the United States.
- Specifically, it would clarify that federal officers and employees serving overseas are protected, and that U.S. courts may try their attackers in a U.S. court of law.

Rep. Cuellar is a Cosponsor of the George Floyd Justice in Policing Act of 2021. [PASSED HOUSE]

- Creates a national standard for the operation of police departments.
- Mandates data collection on police encounters.
- Reprograms existing funds to invest in transformative community-based policing program.
- Streamlines federal law to prosecute excessive force and establish independent prosecutors for police investigations.

Rep. Cuellar is a Cosponsor of the Public Servants Protection and Fairness Act of 2021.

- Ensures that public servants, like fire fighters, can access their social security benefits and their pensions.
- Provides relief payments of \$150 a month to current retirees affected by WEP.
- Establishes the Public Servant Protection (PSP) formula for future retires, to pay Social Security benefits in proportion to the share of a worker's lifetime earnings.
- Includes a permanent benefit guarantee to make sure no current or future retiree receives lower benefits after implementation.
