Firefighters

Fiscal Year (FY) 2023 Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program, Fire Prevention and Safety Grants

Project description: The purpose of the AFG Program is to enhance the safety of the public and firefighters with respect to fire and fire-related hazards. The Grants Programs Directorate administers the Fire Prevention and Safety (FP&S) grants as part of the AFG Program. FP&S offers grants to support activities in two categories: (1) activities designed to reach high-risk target groups and mitigate incidences of death and injuries caused by fire and fire-related hazards ("Fire Prevention and Safety Activity") and (2) research and development activities aimed at improving firefighter safety ("Firefighter Safety Research and Development Activity"). The program guidance document provides potential applicants with the details of the requirements, processing, and evaluation of an application for financial assistance for both of these activity areas.

Fiscal Year 2023 Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grant

Project description: The Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) Grant Programs Directorate implements and administers the Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grants. SAFER grants provide financial assistance to help fire departments increase frontline firefighters. SAFER offers grants to support activities in two activities:

- 1. Hiring of Firefighters
- 2. Recruitment and Retention of Volunteer Firefighters

FY24 Commercial Motor Vehicle Operator Safety Training Program

Project description: This Notice of Funding Opportunity is to solicit applications from organizations that provide commercial motor vehicle operator training, including accredited public or private colleges, universities, vocational-technical schools, post-secondary educational institutions, truck driver training schools, associations, and State and local governments, including Federally recognized Native American Tribal governments.

<u>Capacity Building Assistance (CBA) for HIV Prevention Programs to End the HIV Epidemic in</u> the United States

Project description: This program will constitute a national CBA Provider Network to deliver CBA services to an interdisciplinary HIV prevention workforce (e.g., professional, technical, clinical, and managerial staff) within CDC-funded state and local health departments and Community-based Organizations.

Eligibility:

Sober Truth on Preventing Underage Drinking Act Grants

Project description: The purpose of this program is to prevent and reduce alcohol use among youth and young adults ages 12 to 20 in communities throughout the United States. Award recipients will be expected to implement activities that support capacity building such as implementing evidence-based community approaches, enhancing collaboration, cooperation and

coordination among communities, federal, state, and local and tribal governments, and convening Town Halls.

Eligibility:

• Domestic public and private non-profit entities that are current or former Drug Free Communities (DFC) Support Program recipients.

Application due date: May 3, 2024

Rural Communities Opioid Response Program (RCORP) - Impact

Project description: The purpose of RCORP – Impact is to improve access to integrated and coordinated treatment and recovery services for substance use disorders, including opioid use disorder, in rural areas.

Project description: This program's purpose is to support training programs that enhance and expand paraprofessionals knowledge and expertise, and to increase the number of peer support specialists and other behavioral health-related paraprofessionals who work on integrated, interprofessional teams in providing services to families impacted by opioid use disorder and other substance abuse disorder.

Veterans Legacy Grants Program

Project description: The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) National Cemetery Administration is awarding grants for a maximum of \$400,000 per awardee through the Veterans Legacy Grants Program to provide funding to educational institutions and other eligible entities to conduct cemetery research and produce educational tools for the public to use and learn about the histories of Veterans interred in VA national cemeteries and VA grant-funded State and Tribal Veterans' cemeteries.

Criminal Justice

FY24 Second Chance Act Youth Reentry Program

Project description: This program seeks to address and improve the reentry and recidivism challenges encountered by youth returning to their communities from juvenile residential or correctional facilities.

Eligibility:

- State governments

Application due date: April 15, 2024

FY24 Second Chance Act Community-based Reentry Program

Project description: The Second Chance Act Community-based Reentry Program supports organizations and tribal governments providing comprehensive reentry services to individuals who have been incarcerated. With this solicitation, the Bureau of Justice Assistance seeks applications for funding from community-based non-profit organizations and federally

recognized tribal governments to enhance or implement evidence-based responses to improve reentry, reduce recidivism, and support successful transitional planning for individuals who are currently, or were formerly, involved in the criminal justice system.

Eligibility:
