The Rural eConnectivity Program

Project description: The Rural eConnectivity Program provides loans, grants, and loan/grant combinations to facilitate broadband deployment in rural areas. In facilitating the expansion of broadband services and infrastructure, the program will fuel long-term economic development and opportunities in rural America.

Education and Research

Research in the Formation of Engineers

Project description: The goal of the Research in the Formation of Engineers (RFE) program is to advance our understanding of professional formation. It seeks both to deepen our fundamental understanding of the underlying processes and mechanisms that support professional formation and to demonstrate how professional formation is or can be accomplished. Ultimately RFE aims to transform the engineer-formation system, and thus the impact of proposed projects on this system must be described. Principal Investigators should provide a roadmap detailing how they envision the proposed research will eventually broadly impact practice within the engineer-formation system, even if these activities are not within the scope of the submitted proposal.

Eligibility:

Open to any entity

Application due date: Proposals accepted anytime.

Law Enforcement

<u>Fiscal Year 2024 Rural Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault, and Stalking Program</u>

Project description: The Rural Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault, and Stalking Program supports efforts to enhance the safety of rural victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking and supports projects uniquely designed to address and prevent these crimes in rural areas. This program supports projects that implement, expand, and establish cooperative efforts among law enforcement officers, prosecutors, victim service providers, and other related parties to investigate and prosecute incidents of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking; provide treatment, advocacy, counseling, legal assistance, or other victim services to victims in rural communities; or develop or strengthen programs addressing sexual assault.

<u>Continuous Ketone Monitoring for the Safe Use of Sodium-glucose Cotransporter-2 Inhibitors in</u> Type 1 Diabetes

Project description: The purpose of this notice of funding opportunity is to solicit applications for studies that will develop and test risk mitigation strategies that involve the clinical integration of Continuous Ketone Monitoring for the safe use of Safe Use of Sodium-glucose Contransporter-2 Inhibitors for people living with Type-1 Diabetes so that they may benefit from the cardiac and renal protection and glucose-lowering effects of this drug class.

<u>Grants to Expand Substance Use Disorder Treatment Capacity in Adult and Family Treatment Drug Courts</u>

Project description: The purpose of this program is to expand substance use disorder (SUD) treatment and recovery support services in existing drug courts. The program recognizes the need for treatment instead of incarceration for individuals with SUDs. Recipients are expected to provide prevention, harm reduction, treatment, and recovery services for individuals with SUD involved with the courts.

Eligibility:

Mechanistic Studies on Social Behavior in Substance Use Disorder

Project description: The overarching goal of the supported research projects will be to determine neural and cognitive mechanisms that underlie the relationship between social cognition/behavior and the Substance Use Disorder trajectory.

Community Development

Downtown Revitalization and Main Street Programs

Project description: The Downtown Revitalization and Main Street Program objectives is to provide infrastructure improvements to address the conditions that contribute to the deterioration in an area designated as slum or blighted in the applicant community's downtown or main street area.

Eligibility:

- Cities and counties that are not participating in or designated as eligible for the entitlement portion of the federal Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG).
- Nonentitlement cities that are not currently participating in urban county programs through existing participation agreements.
- Nonentitlement cities are eligible unless their population is counted towards the urban county CDBG allocation.

Application due date: April 3, 2024

Colonia Construction Fund Application

Project description: The Colonia Fund - Construction provides eligible applicants with grants to fund water and wastewater improvements, housing rehabilitation for low- to moderate-income households, the payment of assessments levied against properties owned and occupied by persons of low and moderate income to recover the capital cost for a public improvement and other improvements including street paying and drainage.

Eligibility:

- Counties within 150 miles of the Texas-Mexico border.
- Units of general local government: Limited to nonentitlement areas, with the exception of Hidalgo County.
- Severely distressed unincorporated areas: Specifically, those meeting the definition of a "colonia" based on objective criteria such as lack of potable water supply, inadequate sewage systems, and insufficient decent, safe, and sanitary housing.

Application due date: April 3, 2024

Agriculture and Environment

Clean Ports Program: Climate and Air Quality Planning Competition

Project description: The Environmental Protection Agency's Clean Ports Program will fund climate and air quality planning activities at United States ports – including emissions

inventories, strategy analysis, community engagement, and resiliency measure identification – that will build the capacity of port stakeholders to continue to reduce pollution and transition to zero-emissions operations over time.

Eligibility:

- Port authorities
- State, regional, or local agencies that have jurisdiction over a port authority.
- Air pollution control agencies
- Private entities

Application due date: May 28, 2024

Science and Technology

Next Era of Wireless and Spectrum

Project description: This program seeks to develop the intellectual capital enabling the U.S. to smoothly and quickly transition to effective new ways of using and managing the radio and optical spectrum after the end of the current spectrum era of long-term exclusive-use license auctions, thereby sustaining and advancing the social, economic, scientific, and U.S. national leadership benefits derived from the electromagnetic spectrum.

Eligibility:

- Nonprofit entities
- Nonacademic organizations
- Institutions of higher education

Application due date: May 28, 2024

Arts and Culture

Research Grants in the Arts

Project description: Research Grants in the Arts support research studies that investigate the value and/or impact of the arts, either as individual components of the U.S. arts ecology or as they interact with each other and/or with other domains of American life. The National Endowment of Arts welcomes research proposals that address priority topics and possible questions as outlined in the agency's FY 2022-2026 research agenda.

Eligibility:

- Special district governments
- City or township governments
- State governments
- County governments
- Public and state controlled institutions of higher education
- Independent school districts
